Driver's Ed Course Requirements California

Getting a California first-time driver's license is a thrilling rite of passage for a teen. Yet before you can get behind the wheel, you'll have a few hurdles to overcome. Driver's Ed in California is a teen's first step toward getting a driver's permit, and it's a valuable safe-driving foundation that can help instill good driving habits.

Age and Eligibility for Driver's Ed

Any driver under the age of 18 interested in getting their <u>California</u> <u>driver's permit</u> and ultimately their driver's license is required to take Driver's Ed in California. The minimum age to start a driver's education course is 15.

Is State Approval Necessary?

Yes. The DMV expects students to pass a state-licensed course in order to meet their <u>California driver's education</u> requirement.

How Long Does Driver's Ed Take?

The next step is to make an appointment with the DMV to take your permit test. You can find a complete <u>list of</u> <u>forms</u> you'll need and steps to take on our website. On test day, be prepared to do the following:

- Show proof of your Social Security number
- Turn in a DL 44 permit application form
- > Show your original birth certificate or a certified copy of it, or proof of legal U.S. residency
- Supply a thumbprint

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- Pay the application fee
- Pass a vision test

The driver's permit test includes 46 questions. You'll need to get a minimum of 39 answers correct and you'll have 3 chances to pass. But don't worry, you'll be well-prepared for the DMV exam thanks to your California online Driver's Ed course! If you don't pass, you will be able to retake your test after a 7-day waiting period.
